Seychelles

The Seychelles archipelago is just four degrees south of the equator and consists of 115 islands of two differing types, the inner granite and the outer coralline islands. Mahe, Praslin and La Digue are the most visited of the islands and offer spectacular beaches, exclusive hotels, wild tortoises and a variety of water-sports.

Here, nature remains unspoilt with rare species of birds, unusual fauna, coral reefs and crystal clear waters home to a kaleidoscope of tropical fish and turtles. Some of the smaller islands are luxurious retreats with an eco-friendly philosophy unashamedly aimed at providing the very best for the most discerning of travellers, making island hopping a must.

It is a year round destination with little seasonal variation although from May through to September is drier and less humid. This ultimate dream escape really is a picture perfect paradise.



Lemuria Resort

A superb location by the white sandy beach of Anse Kerlan on Praslin, discreetly set in over 100 hectares of scenic palm groves. The deluxe suites, just metres from the shore, are made of natural materials such as wood, stone, pink granite and thatch so that everything is in total harmony with the environment. Restaurants serving refined cuisine with a blend of Seychellois and French flavours. Amenities include three cascading swimming pools, an 18 hole championship golf course, health and leisure centre, tennis courts and a range of water based activities.

Prices are from £2,230 for five nights half board per person.



L'Archipel

This is an elegant hotel idyllically located in tropical gardens on a hillside overlooking the private beach of Anse Gouvernment on Praslin, perfect for romantic getaways. The spacious deluxe rooms and suites are laid out in an amphitheatre of coconut trees and all boast a terrace with sea views. Its two restaurants offer delicious cuisine including a Creole buffet. There is live entertainment three times a week and amenities include a swimming pool, fitness centre, windsurfing, and boat transfers to the outer islands.

Prices are from £1,349 for five nights half board per person.



Plantation Club

Amid an old 180 acre coconut plantation lies the first class Plantation Club looking over half a mile of glorious white sand on Mahe. Its luxurious rooms and suites have a balcony or terrace facing the sea or the hotel's spectacular fresh water lagoon and offer all the modern amenities. There is a selection of bars and restaurants featuring Creole and international dishes. Facilities include a swimming pool, dive centre, fitness centre, casino and evening entertainment.

Prices are from £769 for five nights half board per person.



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
